



















Acceptance and Commitment to Empowerment (ACE) Intervention: Reducing HIV Stigma & Promoting Community Resilience through Capacity Building

Funded by the Canadian Institute of Health Research (CIHR)

ACE is a program to reduce HIV related stigma and promote collective empowerment. The goal of Phase One of the ACE Project is to learn more about: (1) the challenges faced by racialized people experiencing or affected by HIV related stigmas, (2) their psychosocial needs, and (3) existing community strategies to reduce these stigmas.

Do you self-identify as:

a woman belonging to a racialized minority or immigrant community? experiencing or affected by HIV related stigmas? living in one of the six project cities (Calgary, Edmonton, Greater Toronto Area (GTA), London, Niagara, Ottawa)? 18 years of age or older? Fluent in English?

> If so, we invite you to take part in our study to share your knowledge, insights, and perspectives.

Joining this study will involve taking part in a 2-hour focus group online via zoom with other women in the community between 6 to 8 participants. You will be asked to complete a short demographic survey and join a focus group to discuss issues related to HIV related stigma and strategies to reduce that stigma. All focus group discussions will be audio--recorded which makes it impossible for you to participate if you do not want to be audio-recorded.

Taking part in this study is entirely voluntary and private.

- You may withdraw at any time.
- You do not need to provide your real name
- You will receive a small honorarium (\$40) when you attend the focus group session.
- The research team will keep the information you share private. Since a focus group involves many participants, confidentiality cannot be guaranteed. We will ask all participants to honour and respect each other's privacy.
